Modal verbs	
vouloir = to want	Je veux – I want Tu veux – You want Il/Elle veut – he/she wants On veut – we want
devoir = to have to	Je dois – I must Tu dois – You must Il/Elle doit – he/she must On doit – we must
pouvoir = to be able to	Je peux – I can Tu peux – You can Il/Elle peut – he/she can On peut – we can

Modal verbs are usually followed by an infinitive:
Je veux chanter = I want to sing.

Infinitives

There are 3 types of infinitives:
- **er, -ir and -re.**

It is the form of the verb that is listed in the dictionary and it often means **'to...'** or **'...ing'**.

Mon talent c'est jouer de la guitare My talent is **playing** the guitar

Je veux être chanteuse professionnelle I want **to be** a professional singer

Imperatives

You use the imperative to tell someone what to do.
Use the *tu* form of the verb and drop the *tu*.

Tu fais – you make

Fais plus d'efforts – **make** more of an effort.

With –er verbs, you have to take off the 's' at the end of the 'tu' form of the verb.

Tu regardes – you look at

Regarde la caméra – **look at** the camera

Adjective endings	
You need to agree the endings of adjectives to match the noun by adding the following endings.	
Masculine (m)	
Feminine (f)	e
Masculine plural (m pl)	s
Feminine plural (f pl)	es

Superlative adjectives

You use the superlative form of the adjective to say 'the most' or 'the least'.

The superlative is made up of 3 parts:

le/la/les + plus/moins + adjective

The adjective ending must agree with the noun it refers to:
Il est le plus travailleur = He is the most hardworking
Elles sont les moins ambitieuses = They are the most ambitious.
