

## OAW History Curriculum

Studying history at Oasis Academy Wintringham gives students an understanding of Britain's past and the wider world. History develops students' intellectual curiosity and their ability to think critically, a skill that is crucial in today's modern world. Studying history gives students the opportunity to weigh up evidence, examine arguments and develop perspective and judgement. History also helps students understand the complexity of the world. This understanding is developed through using second order concepts such as: cause & consequence, change & continuity, similarity & difference, significance and the use of interpretations and evidence.
