There are some excellent films on Netflix, Amazon Prime and also BBC iPlayer. Here are some of my favourites;

- Cabaret (1972) gives a good sense of culture during the Weimar Republic.
- Hitler: The Rise of Evil (2003) chronology about Hitler's rise to power, particularly between 1929-1933.
- Sophie Scholl-The Final Days (2005) –youth resistance group 'the White Rose'.
- Schindler's List (1993) –documenting the persecution of the Jews.
- Conspiracy (2001) how the Final Solution came about i.e. the Wannsee Conference (1942).
- Valkyrie (2008) the July Bomb plot.
