In half term 4 (20th February 2023-31st March 2023), Y8 will learn the following topics.

2	What makes a romantic relationship healthy and respectful?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To describe qualities of a healthy and respectful romantic relationship
3	How do we manage our relationships online?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To describe appropriate uses of online media when discussing our relationships To explain the issues of catfishing and exploitation
4	Managing strong emotions in a relationship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To describe the types of emotions we feel when in a relationship To explain how we can manage strong emotions in a relationship
5	What is consent?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To describe what peer pressure and consent is To explain the importance of consent in everyday life to make others comfortable
6	How do we manage a breakup?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To describe emotions associated with a breakup To explain how we manage our breakup and manage the digital legacy of a relationship
