Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance



Since the Government announced a return to normality, following a pro-longed period of Covid related restrictions, we have been ramping up what we offer in our careers education, information advice and guidance, once again welcoming visitors onto our site.

Earlier this year we secured funding from the Humber Outreach Programme, HOP, which has funded additional careers advice on a 1:1 basis for students in both Key Stage 3 and 4. By encouraging students to consider their futures, they are better prepared to understand how what they do now impacts on opportunities available later. Sally Lumby, our internal careers advisor, has also continued to work tirelessly to support our Y11 students in thinking about their next steps.

We have had several external learning partners into the Academy to support our programme and we would like to express our thanks to them all. In January, Moj Taylor delivered a raising aspirations presentation to all students in years 9 to 11. Moj works for "PUSH" an organisation which supports school-leavers and students, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds to make well informed decisions about their futures and to have the skills and resources to make their choices a reality.

We also had a performance delivered to Years 8 and 9 by, "Performance in Education," a theatre group who through drama, analysed the range of decisions young people must make as they navigate their way through a wide range of options available to them. Students were left with little doubt as to the differences between academic and vocational pathways and showed increased awareness of the opportunities presented by apprenticeships and traineeships.

More recently, George Morgan visited to highlight the benefits gained by school leavers through participation in the National Citizen Service and Elizabeth Wild came in to support our Y11 students with post 16 applications.

For National Careers Week, Jonathan Hobbs, a local business entrepreneur, and founder of the Titan Trans Haulage company also presented his inspirational story to students in Years 8 and 9, and clearly communicated that a passion and will to succeed, coupled with hard work, can take you anywhere.

We were also delighted to welcome back a large range of learning partners from further and higher education, traineeships and apprenticeships, and employers as part of our Annual Careers Fair. All students participated in this event.

NSPCC Rocks




